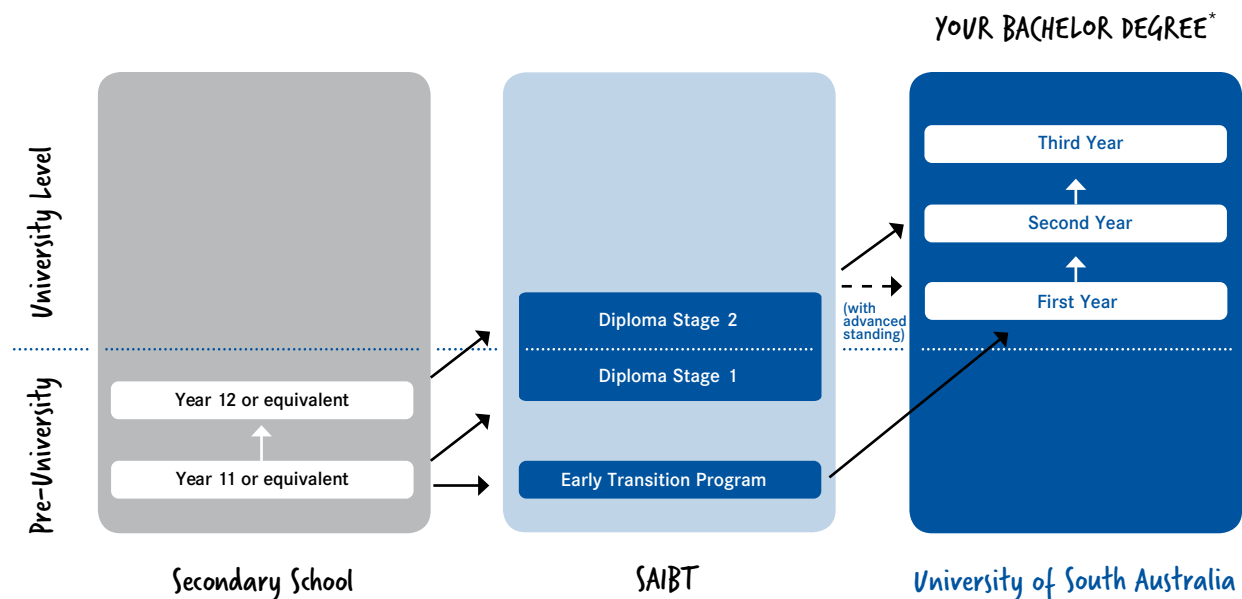

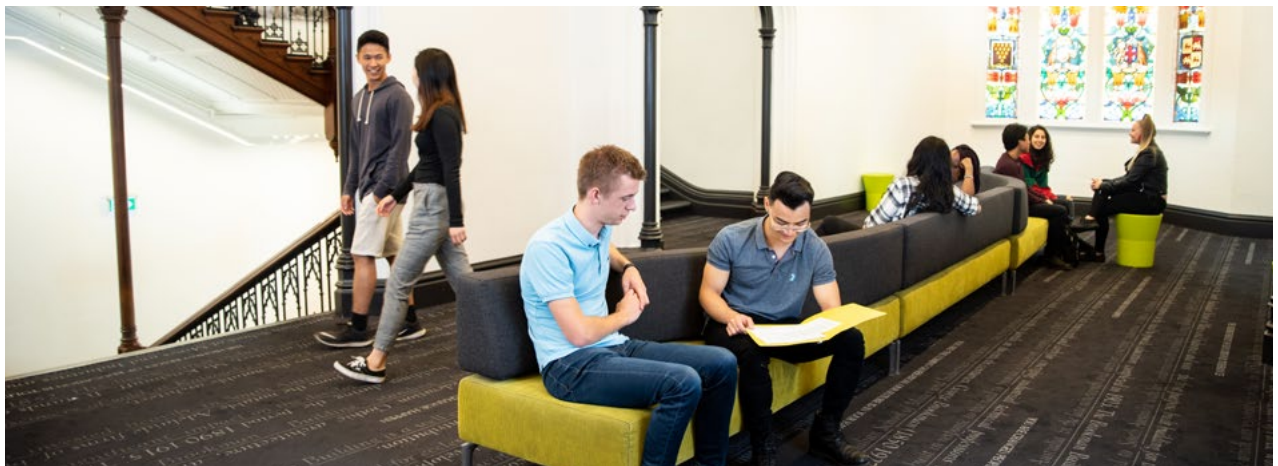

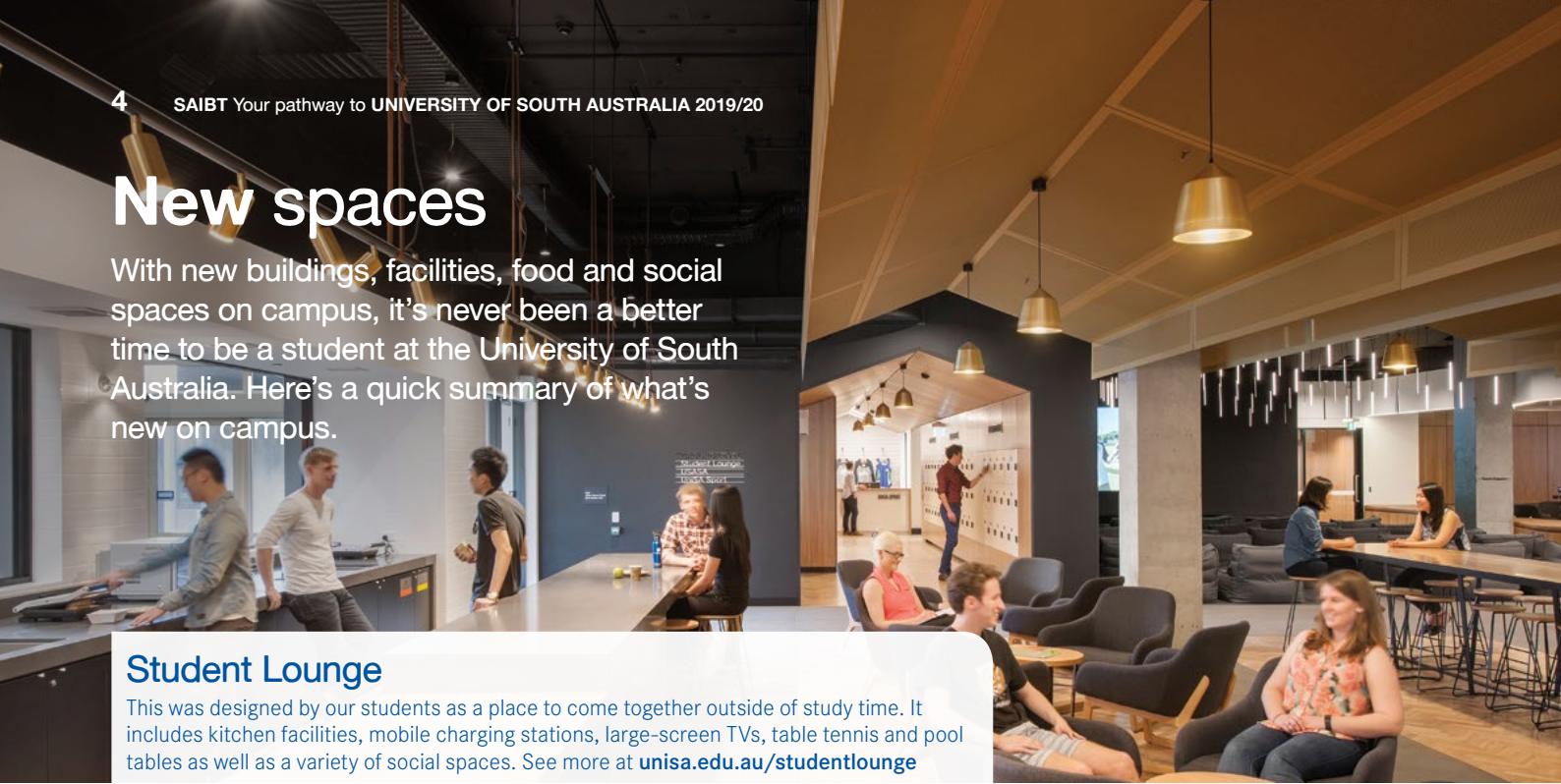

With new buildings, facilities, food and social spaces on campus, it's never been a better time to be a student at the University of South Australia. Here's a quick summary of what's new on campus.



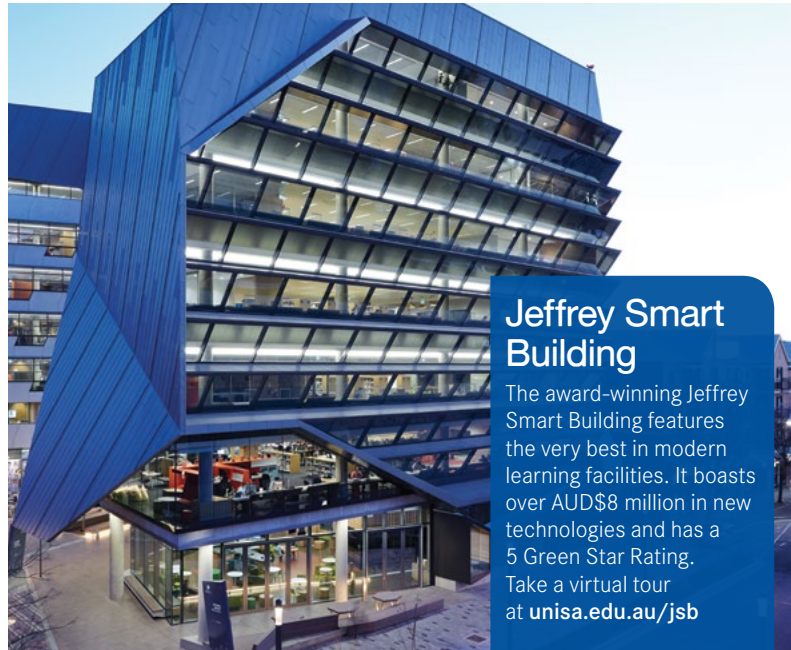
Student Lounge

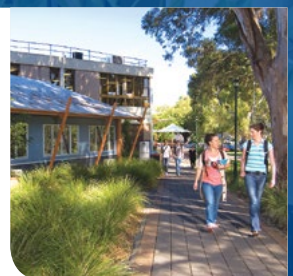



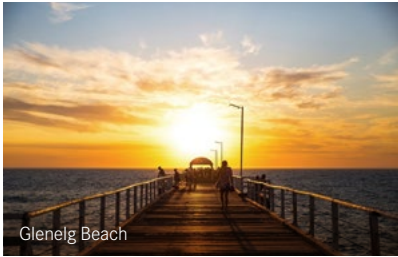
